artists, guest artist performances, screen dance presentations, an emphasis on student research presentations, and opportunities to investigate dance and create happenings in settings specific to the host school.



#### BE CURIOUS - DIVE IN AND DIVE DEEP

• If you are an undergraduate and are thinking about graduate school, talk to faculty from universities with Master's degree programs.
